The Redwood Small World club's annual Play Day, held in March, was a big success. Our project was a quarter-round roombox finished with a quilting theme. Two of these roomboxes were entered in the local Redwood Acres Fair for judging and both won awards in their division and class. Our annual Play Day takes a lot of planning and preparation so work is already well underway on our 2011 Play Day project, a vintage-style market stall.

On May 1, Redwood Small World's "Street of Shoppes" had its first showing at a meeting of the local chapter of the AAUW (American Association of University Women). I don't think any of us realized that our shops would take quite so much of our free time to finish! Making or finding enough "stock" to fill them is a big job.

Eleven shops, at the time in various stages of completion, were lined up for viewing by more than 50 AAUW members who clustered two-deep on both sides of the display tables to examine them. The interest shown in our work, and the depth of questions asked about it, was very gratifying. It was also very interesting to discover that many AAUW members have an interest in hobby themselves. know someone or are related to someone who does.

Club member Carolynn Walden gave a talk at the AAUW meeting that discussed the miniatures hobby and its history, how the design of London shops and attitudes towards marketing and shopping have changed over the centuries, our Street of Shoppes project, our club and how members pursue the hobby "behind the Redwood Curtain", and then took questions from the audience. Carolynn's talk was so popular that she has been asked to speak at meetings of two other service clubs in Humboldt County.

The May 1 showing of our Street of Shoppes was a test run for a more formal display at the Redwood Acres Fair, held in Eureka June 23-27. The fair provided 24 feet of display space for the Street of

Shoppes, and this time, the shops were all completed and "open for business". The club opted not to have the shops judged as entries in the fair. Instead, the Redwood Acres Fair provided ballots for a Viewer's Choice winner. Carolynn Walden's "Piccadilly Masquerade" shop was selected by fairgoers as the over-all favorite. Sharon Ocheltree's "China Hutch" and Jackie Taylor's "Green Door Antique Shop" took 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3rd place in the Viewer's Choice ballot. Each day of the fair, a duo of Redwood Small World club members worked on miniature projects of their choice at the fair to demonstrate the hobby and answer questions from fair-goers.

The club will do-it-all-again at upcoming Humboldt County Fair, held in Ferndale August 12-22 this year. Our "Street of Shoppes" will be on display, club members will give demonstrations of the hobby each afternoon, and members will enter their work for judging. Both of the fairs allow a team of club members to set up the Miniature Arts display after judging, to assure that all pieces are handled carefully and shown to their best advantage. The club sponsors a Best In Show prize for the Miniature Arts category at each fair.

Starting in September, we will display our work at local library branches in Humboldt County through the month of December! The Street of Shoppes is too large to display at any of the libraries, but we have lots of other stuff...old and new...that we are looking forward to sharing.
