

How can we be writing reports for the Spring Newsletter when it is the middle of winter! Actually, we've been very lucky this year. After an early wet start, we've had a surprisingly mild winter with only one real "storm" as of the end of January. The only disappointment in that is that I haven't had weather as an excuse to hibernate at home, working on miniature projects.

We are getting ready to host our annual Play Day on March 17. Our project this year is a Peddler's Cart, a project we found on Joann Swanson's wonderful blog (<u>h t t p : / /</u> www.joannswansondiyminiatures .blogspot.com/2011 04 01 archi ve.html). I'm especially interested in this project, as we don't have to enlist the help of anyone's husband to cut a lot of wood parts for us. We always look forward to working with miniaturists in our area who aren't members of our club, and we will be meeting and making some new friends this year. (A photo of our prototype cart is enclosed.)

We are also looking ahead to the two local fairs in our area, where we enter our projects for judging in the Miniature Arts category, set up a non-judged display of a larger group project, and demonstrate different miniatures techniques and projects each day. The Redwood Acres Fair in Eureka is held June 21-24. The Humboldt County Fair in Ferndale is held August 15-26, and this year will be the 116th year of that fair. The staff at both fairs

works with us to protect miniature entries and non-judged displays, and ensures that everything is shown in the best manner. The Redwood Small World club sponsors a prize for 'Best-In-Show, Amateur Entry' at each fair.

We are proud to report that Carolynn Walden's Piccadilly Masquerade Shop will be featured in the March issue American Miniaturist magazine. All the members of the Redwood Small World club finished, decorated and stocked a three story plywood shell, and we have displayed the finished shops together as our 'Street of Shoppes' at several local venues. While the same plvwood shell was used by each club member, the completed shops are unique, and reflect each owner's style, interests, and skill level. Carolynn's shop is outstanding, and it was on display at the Good August Sam Show last where it was photographed by Michael Puff for the magazine. Carolynn wrote an article to accompany the photos, which describes the development of the project and includes tips and hint on displaying miniature items within a scene like her shop.


