HAPPY SUMMER!

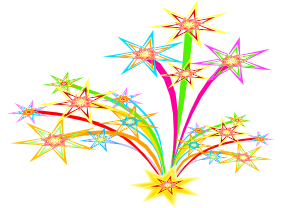

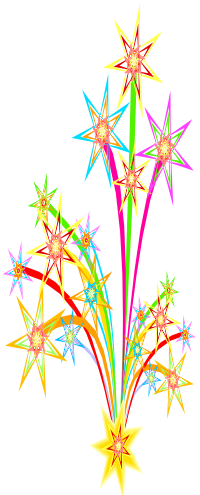

The Art of Passing Along the Mini Torch

NAME is about sharing and that covers passing down our love of miniatures to younger generations. So I wanted to highlight N-2 Region people who are doing just that in hopes that it will inspire you to seek out educational opportunities where you can. Below is Lola Renner's story. — Chris Cordner
 Based out of Magalia, Calif., Lola has been designing and making dollhouse miniatures since 1978. At the age of nine, she had her first business license and sold her artwork to her first store at the age of 12. In the early 1970's she was making tiny stuffed animals in unique scenes and sold them as Christmas ornaments to Allied Artist Guild in Menlo Park. She then discovered Fimo and began creating tiny candies, cakes, and other foods to go with her ornaments. Miniature store owners saw the creations and the orders for **Lola Originals** miniatures began pouring in. She then received Artisan status in 1998 from IGMA and began branching out from her lollipop stands, candy stick displays, and wedding cakes. She now enjoys making all sorts of fruit and appetizer trays. "I love making miniatures because they make people happy. I had a customer write me when she had had a bad day and said when she got my package she went and sat on her bed to open it and it brought joy to her day," she says. Lola's daughter Debbie Heard was brought into the fold starting at the age of 10 by working at shows with her father. At the age of 18 she started full time producing minis that Lola designed. In recent years she has branched out by selling miniature estates in addition to her continued work with her mother in the **Lola Originals** business.
 "It's a great feeling to be able to pass on my love of miniatures to my daughter," Lola says.

Students will learn techniques including how to finish a faux flagstone floor, an easy technique for stained glass, finishing hardwood, and other metallic and faux-finishes.

According to Nell, working in this scale is similar to making accessories in 1:12 scale. Accurate cutting and measuring is the only requirement.



Silver Soldering Lights: Three Different Lamps

Taught by Jim Pounder

Students will work with metals, using silver soldering techniques and the skills required in the fabrication of miniature lamps. They will make two desk lamps and one floor lamp.

Silver Soldering Brass Bed

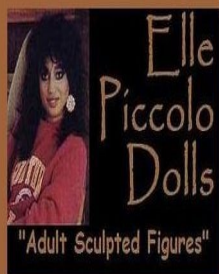
Students will construct a twin-sized bed frame in a style of a late 19th century "iron" bed frame with silver soldering.

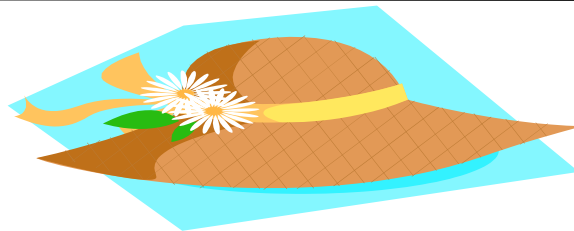

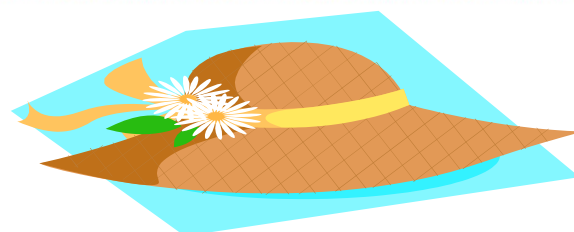

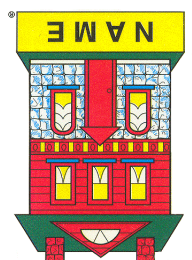
