

Remembering Joanne



Joanne Grundhofer, State Representative for the North Coast area of NAME's N2 region, passed away suddenly on Jan. 14, 2014. She served as president of the **Redwood Small World** miniature club for many years (at the insistence of club members) before passing on the hat so she could travel more.



She leaves behind her husband of 59 years, Ray, and a devoted extended family. At a service in remembrance of her life, it was obvious that the sphere of people whose lives were changed because they knew Joanne is large and diverse. Many people shared stories, both touching and humorous, about Joanne. So many said that she was like a mother to them, or a sister, an aunt, a grandma or a great-grandma. I always knew that Joanne was a staunch San Francisco 49er's fan, but I thought that was because Ray was a football fan. I was surprised (and tickled) to learn that Joanne might have been the bigger



fan, that she "worked" with the cheerleaders, and that she'd met many players over the years. One family related how, on their first motorhome trip to a 49er's game, Joanne walked up to their space while they were setting up, introduced herself, and started to pepper them with questions. They think of Joanne and Ray as part of their family now and vice versa. So many other people had similar stories to tell. When I moved to Humboldt County and joined the **Redwood Small World** club, I felt that Joanne took me under her wing. She was like that with everyone, everywhere. Not only could she talk to anyone about anything (and she would), but she was truly interested in your ideas, what was going on in your life, and she was ready to champion you in whatever you were going to do next. — **Sharon Spencer**

"For the members of the **Redwood Small World** miniature club, Joanne was the organizer, the spark, and the inspiration for so many different events and projects. Whether it was a meeting at her home, a play day at Scrapper's Edge, a workshop in



Sacramento, an exhibit or demonstration of our work at the fair, or a display of miniatures at library branches throughout the County – all were enthusiastically entered into with her leading us. Joanne was a classy lady, right down to her pretty painted fingernails. Her beautiful home was open to us all, whether we needed help with a project, needed a place to hold a meeting, or just wanted to visit. Everything she created showed her wonderful flair in the miniature world. Her exquisite room boxes, her plans for that 'super' dollhouse, and all her individual projects were beautifully executed. How much we learned from her! Some of my favorite projects presented by Joanne were a three-tiered wedding cake, learning to make silk roses, and a landscaping project. Joanne made so many creative miniatures, like the rug made of French knots using embroidery thread, hand-knitted miniature sweaters, and porcelain mannequins dressed in gowns of tiny beads. Joanne would spend her evenings working on these projects while watching TV or sitting in the motor home. 'Always use tweezers!'...that was her advice, her mantra. Joanne, along with her husband Ray, made many friends at home and wherever they traveled, and travel they did – to 49er games, to miniature shows and workshops, and across our beautiful country in their motorhome. Joanne and Ray were such a great team. We miss you, Joanne. You left us too soon."





That basically describes Peggy **Puckett**'s miniature shop in Santa Rosa, Calif. In the mini business for over 30 years, Peggy has created a place full of variety—dolls, room boxes, dollhouses built and shells, lighting, building material, plants, furniture, and accessories are among her many offerings, which are primarily 1:12 scale. She started her miniature journey with the gift of a dollhouse kit and a quest for supplies. After not finding good help, she decided to open her own shop, initially out of a room

in a dog food factory where she worked. She then transitioned to a shop at her home and now uses a refurbished garage at her latest home as her newest shop, open now for around two years. She also heads out on the occasional road trip, selling at local shows such as **Good Sam** and **CHAMPS**. Peggy enjoys the thrill of finding estates for her ever-changing stock almost as much as having people visit her shop to say hello. I've stopped by many a time to find her ready for a chat about the latest in the miniature world and even better, a good belly laugh.
