I was in the Miniatures Project for three years, my last three years of 4-H. Oh, the fun we had.

When I married my husband, Michael, and we had our daughter, Mara, my two room boxes came along with me. (A Christmas room box and a little girl's bedroom room box. Well, everyone needs those.) I always hoped to get back into it. I took Mara with me on my occasional visits to The Elegant Dollhouse here in Sacramento. I was the only one enraptured, I'm afraid. Then one day I saw a flyer there at Elegant's—for a new miniature club. I eventually called Renate Winter, and joined at their fourth meeting in April of 2008. The Itty Bitties was my first mini club as an adult, and we have a wonderful time. It is a one inch scale club, and became a NAME club in 2010. We usually make a small project each meeting. Each member pretty much has a chance to teach once

a year. I redid my first two room boxes, finished two more, and have two I'm working on.

I joined the Quarter Persuasion Club at their second meeting in February of 2013. It's a quarter scale club, (as the name suggests), and I have really grown to enjoy this scale. Each member teaches once or twice a year. We have continuing projects (little houses, etc.) or we teach one or several small items. I had only finished one quarter scale project prior to joining this club. Now I have an additional four that are complete, and several more "in progress." I have found that I like 1:144th scale, too. It's pretty tiny, but I like it. I plan to make a room box in half-inch scale at some point, too. I just want to try it.

Online, I am in the NAME Yahoo group, the Quarter Connection Yahoo group, and the Micro Minis (1:144th scale) Yahoo group. The help from other miniaturists is wonderful, and the projects and printies are THE BEST.

When The Itty Bitties became a NAME club, I joined NAME. I love the Miniature Gazette so much. I search for older issues, too, so I have more ideas for Christmas gifts to make for my mini friends, and projects to teach each year.

I am really excited to be the Sacramento/Central Valley State Rep for the next two and a half years! I want to give back. I was able to help Connie Younker and Darwin Spring a bit when they were State Reps for Sacramento/Central Valley. NAME has given so much to me over the last, well, 35 years, really.
