SUMMARY FROM THE BOARD MEETING OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF MINIATURE ENTHUSIASTS (NAME) HELD ON OCTOBER 22, 2020

Financial Summary: Fiscal Year June 1, 2020-May 31, 2021

Budgeted Income for the year: \$254,243.00

Income YTD (September 30, 2020) \$100,938.50 (39.7% of budgeted income)

Budgeted Expenses for the Year: \$253,045.00

Expenses YTD (September 30, 2020) \$98,479.28 (38.9% of budgeted expenses)

Year to Date Profit: \$2459.22

Fundraising: MaKitz sales are still strong. A Trick or Treat Raffle on the new Create website has already sold 92 tickets. The Online Garage Sale has been as successful as the in-person events.

Convention/Houseparty Liaison: The Board passed a motion to restrict half-table sales to new dealers and past dealers who have not sold at NAME events for five years. The Dealer application form will be modified to reflect this. The application form for Workshops was modified to clarify phot restrictions for clarity of items included in the workshops.

Website: The new create.miniatures.org site is up and running. A workshop is scheduled for November and under discussion for December. Each month will showcase new games, puzzles and content.

Auctions: An additional fifty cent shipping fee will be added to auction sales through December to offset USPS increases.

RC Liaison: A NAME member has suggested a Cookie Exchange by mail event for interested clubs. The information will be sent to RCs for dissemination to State Reps and clubs.

SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF MINIATURE ENTHUSIASTS (NAME) HELD ON NOVEMBER 19, 2020

Financial Summary: Fiscal Year June 1, 2020–May 31, 2021

Budgeted Income for the year: \$254,243.00

Income YTD (October 31, 2020) \$120,447.28 (47.4% of budgeted income)

Budgeted Expenses for the Year: \$253,045.00

Expenses YTD (October 31, 2020) \$121926.24 (48.1% of budgeted expenses)

Website: President Roy Moore reported that Dan Stewart has resigned from the Tech Consulting and Webmaster positions. Eric Moore is managing the site duties temporarily.

Fundraising: The end-of-year giving letter has been printed and stuffed, and will be mailed November 20. President Moore reminded everyone there will be no December Board meeting. The traditional face-to-face January meeting will be replaced with a virtual ZOOM meeting.

Publicity: The NAME newsletter continues to be well-received and the membership is responding well to the Create site activities. The "Trick or Treat" raffle on the Create site brought in \$1190 and all prizes have been mailed to the winners.

NAME Day 2021 The Tiki Bar

Welcome to the 2021 Tiki Bar, the theme of our NAME Day project this year. Perhaps you would want it on a beachfront? Maybe in the backyard by the pool? How about a Tiki Bar ambience at a ball game or County fair? Maybe just a scene on it's own? You can serve cold drinks using the cooler that is a part of the project for storing ice, store your glasses, bottles, whatever on the shelves, put some nice bar stools in front to sit on and relax. You might want to do some landscaping around the bar, include some little tables and chairs around a patio. So many options and this will be a complete project this year. Only for 2021. No further projects to wait a whole year for.

Again, one 1" free kit will be available for groups who register their events with the NAME Day Committee but they will not be shipped out until mid-April, 2021. Cutter lists will be posted in April also.

The official NAME Day for 2021 is October 2nd, first Saturday of October. Some events are scheduled a little after that or a little before because of local conflicts, but October 2nd is the official NAME Day.


