My first doll house came on Christmas day when I was five, along with a case of measles sending me to bed when I felt fine and wanted so much to play with the doll house.

As an adult, had wanted a doll house for a long time and I finally received a doll house kit for my birthday one year. After building the Farmhouse style dollhouse, the house needed furniture and so my real journey began--finding miniature stores and going to miniature shows to find just the perfect pieces of furniture. At the time, there were lots of miniature stores and shows, which sadly have disappeared over the years. One of those first shows that I remember was in Golden Gate Park in San Francisco, and I was totally in awe. So many wonderful "little" things, it was unbelievable!!

Over the years, Margaret and I co-chaired two State Days put on by our club, a Southwest building and a Japanese Teahouse—so much fun and enjoyed by all who attended.

My work schedule allowed me summers off and so one summer I discovered Pinterest and with it many ideas for making miniatures. I fell in love with a Market Stall made by someone in Germany and gave it a try. My OCD kicked in at that point and one became many. I had so many ideas for themes, and kept building. When I attended a Mini Cals workshop in Morgan Hill, I brought several of my market stalls for "show and tell' and ended up selling two of them. After the Campfire in Paradise in 2018, I moved to Burney, CA which is even farther north and away from everything, with no nearby clubs or shops. To give me something to do and continue making, I started selling items on Etsy. I have not only kept busy building and selling things, but have made new friends from afar.
