Miniatures and me? I started as a child, took a break during young adulthood, and then returned. I played with baby dolls and Barbies—I had a Barbie townhouse. Two favorite cousins and my sister and I made paper furniture (approximately ½" scale) while visiting our grandparents in Healdsburg. I was lucky enough to be a member of the American River 4-H club when Glenva Conklin started her Miniatures Project there. When I joined the Miniatures Project in 7th grade, life lit up. Mrs. Conklin was a wonderful teacher. I took Miniatures for three years, and I was a Teen Leader for the Beginning Miniatures Project (held a different day than the Intermediate Miniatures Project) that third year. Those three years were The Best. I exhibited several of my finished scenes at the Sacramento County Fair. I helped demonstrate how to make Fimo candies at the California State Fair with Mrs. Conklin and other club members (including my sister Genny). Genny (short for Genevieve) took Miniatures with me for years two and three. She displays the darling 1920's era 1" scale kitchen room box scene she made in her living room now. She used to display it high in her kitchen. I've dreamed of her returning to miniatures.

I liked to visit The Elegant Dollhouse through the years, as I still had an interest in miniatures, even though I wasn't doing anything new. Often I took Mara along with me. The year she was graduating from Rosemont High School (she graduated June of 2008), I noticed a flier for a new Miniatures club. I let that percolate through my brain. Then in March or April of 2008, I called Renate Winter from the flier. I joined the Itty Bitties Miniature club in April of 2008 (at their 4th meeting). When the Itty Bitties became a NAME club in 2010, I became a NAME member for the first time. I so enjoy the Miniature Gazette, NAME's bimonthly magazine! Getting all those miniature crafting projects in the Gazette was what I first found delightful. Later on, I became interested in what other miniaturists were doing, and in the Houseparties and Nationals! I've been to all three of NAME's online Houseparties. I attended the March 2017 Sacramento Houseparty, which was fantastic! I volunteered for a few hours there, and earned a Gold Star volunteer pin. I hope to attend another NAME Houseparty, or a National, in person sometime. My current local club is Quarter Persuasion, which I joined at their second meeting (in February of 2013). I had an interest in quarter scale when I joined, and it is now my favorite scale. That's a good thing, since Michael and I live in a one-bedroom apartment! We did live in a two-bedroom apartment for MOST of Mara's years with us (the one-bedroom was the early years, when her crib was in the living room). I stayed in the Itty Bitties for nine years. The Itty Bitties is currently the only 1" scale club in Sacramento, and it is always full (with a waiting list) at 12 members. Through trial and error, they have found that they can't have more than 12 people in order to meet in each other's houses. I hope to help start a second 1" scale club for the Sacramento area. We definitely need one. I hope to help start clubs in other areas of Region N-2 also.
