The Mell Prescott Award is the highest honor that NAME can bestow on an individual. At this year's convention, Barbara Thornton-Hilll was presented the award by Debbie Young, head of the awards committee.


Barbara has had a long association with miniatures and NAME. She became interested in dollhouse miniatures in 1984. She took a class at a local miniature store and was hooked, joining a club and NAME, and now, 40 years later, she is still completely absorbed with the miniature world and NAME. She attended her first convention in 1988 and found the Village Miniatures Store in San Jose shortly after that where she took many classes, met Debbie Young and became a quarter scale enthusiast.

Barbara became involved in several local miniature clubs, miniature events and attended many conventions and houseparties. Around 1998, she became a State Rep in her region and moved on to Regional Coordinator in 2000. She took that job off and on for 20+ years, as needed by the region.

In 2007, Barbara joined the NAME Board as the first Special Events Coordinator and continued on the Board for 13 years in various capacities (RC Coordinator, Secretary, Second Vice President).
