IT'S HERE!!!!!! It's time for Camp Make A Mini again. I can't believe July is just around a couple of corners. Camp Make A Mini for 2025 is an A-Frame style house. We have two instructors/vendors for this year and two styles to choose from. Workshops will be on July 12 for Preble McDaniel and July 13 for Alician Pearce. During Camp week, there will be extra games, puzzles, tutorials on the Create site and Quick Minis (lots of small kits similar to Roundtables at the conventions). These kits will, hopefully, be furniture and accessories for the A-Frames.

The two styles of A-Frames will only be available in pre-cut kits in ½" scale but plans are available for purchase to cut your own in ½"/1:24 and 1"/1:12 scales. The reason for this is the incredible expense of buying and dealing with the larger wood (much of which cannot be cut with a laser cutter AND the shipping costs. Many dealers/cutters do not want to cut, package and ship larger scales.

The week will culminate with the usual Campfire Zoom on Saturday, July 19th. Here is a brief preview. Go to create miniatures org, pull down menu "Sign Me Up" then "Creat-ive Offerings" to see more details and to order.

Itty Bitties: In March, we were fortunate to have Dr. Debra Taylor lead a workshop on dollhouse miniature wiring. She provided in-depth instruction on identifying voltage in random lighting fixtures—specifically how to determine whether a light operates on 3V, 9V, or 12V. This valuable information is directly supporting our 2025 club project: creating book nooks. One highlight from this initiative is Connie Ribble's Harry

Potter-themed book nook, shown here (in progress). She applied her new knowledge to install a flickering red light and a handmade chandelier—both created and wired by hand.

In April, Dr. Taylor returned to teach us how to create miniature books with bound pages using a fold-and-glue technique. We're excited to welcome her back later this year for another session, where she will teach hand-sewn miniature bookbinding. We are especially excited to learn different techniques in bookmaking, as several of our member's book nook projects will have an opportunity to display these books.


On Saturday, May 3, we held our annual garage sale at a new venue in Sacramento. The event featured 35 sales tables and was a great success.
